BASIC HOME, HOUSEKEEPING AND HYGIENE ORIENTATION CHECKLIST

HOME and HOUSEKEEPING

<u>KITCHEN</u>:

- \Box Stove how to turn burners and oven on and make sure the burners are off when done
- \Box Refrigerator which foods should be refrigerated and which frozen
- \Box Cupboards which foods should be stored here
- \Box Sink only water can go down the drain
- \Box Store all food in the kitchen and eat only in the kitchen or dining area
- □ Show proper cleaning supplies and demonstrate proper use of cleaners and cleaning tools
- \Box Dishes and Cookware clean with dish soap after each meal, dry
- □ Counters clean after each use so as not to attract bugs or rodents
- \Box Cleaning sinks and drains
- □ Cleaning stove, microwave, other appliances
- □ Floor sweep daily; vacuuming/sweeping and mopping
- \Box Cleaning tables and chairs
- \Box Cleaning cupboards and other storage areas
- □ Refrigerator (inside, outside and underneath)
- \Box Cleaning windows
- □ Proper disposal of garbage and recyclables

Other Items/Comments:

LIVING AREA(S):

- \Box During warm weather, open windows during the day to air out the home; close and lock 1^{st} floor windows when not at home and at night
- □ All clothing, toys and other articles must be cleaned up off the floor at the end of the day
- □ Demonstrate proper use of cleaning supplies and tools
- \Box Dusting
- □ Sweep or vacuum floors on a weekly basis or as needed
- □ Vacuuming, sweeping furnishings as needed
- \Box Cleaning of windows
- □ Cleaning stains on floor, walls or furnishings

Other Items/Comments:

BEDROOMS:

- □ General neatness and cleanliness
- \Box Changing the sheets and making bed
- \Box Vacuuming, sweeping
- \Box Dusting

Other Items/Comments:

BATHROOMS:

- \Box Sink do not put anything down the sink other than water; do not leave water running
- □ Toilet must be flushed after each use; do not fill with excessive toilet paper; use a plunger if the water does not run down
- □ Bathtub/Shower make sure shower curtain is inside the tub or shower stall to avoid water on the floor; any water that gets on the floor must be mopped up immediately
- □ Bathroom must be kept clean on a daily basis
- □ Demonstrate proper use of cleaners and cleaning tools
- □ Cleaning toilet and proper use of toilet
- □ Cleaning bathtub/shower, sink, walls, mirror, tile, floor

Other Items/Comments:

LAUNDRY:

- □ Demonstrate proper use of detergent, washer and dryer
- \Box Clean lint trap regularly

Other Items/Comments:

GARBAGE REMOVAL:

- \Box Use plastic bag liners for garbage containers
- □ Remove garbage bags on a regular basis or when nearly full; tie securely and put in garbage receptacles outside of the home
- □ Put garbage receptacles at the curb for city pick-up on the appointed days

Other Items/Comments:

OTHER ISSUES:

□ Alert Anchor Relative or Volunteers or regular staff to <u>ANY</u> housing problems such as faulty appliances, water problems, loss of heat or broken windows

Other Items/Comments:

HYGIENE ISSUES

- □ Explain contents and use of items in personal hygiene kit
- \Box Use of deodorant and at least daily bathing with soap
- □ Wash hands with soap frequently, especially if preparing food and after use of toilet
- \Box Dental care

Other Items/Comments:

SAFETY ISSUES

- \Box Demonstrate the testing and changing of batteries in smoke alarms
- □ Demonstrate changing lightbulbs
- □ Reporting broken windows, inoperable locks & other hazardous situations
- □ Child care issues: walk together; stay close to home; properly clothed, shoed and cleaned; medical care; quiet after hours, etc.
- □ Call Anchor Relative or Volunteers or Case Manager if you need assistance.
- \Box Case Manager's telephone number
- □ Call 911 for an emergency: this means in case of a fire or if you need immediate medical assistance or the police
