Topic: Employment (International Organization for Migration, Overseas Processing Entity, Bangkok)

Activity: Children's Problems in School

Introduction	The reality of resettlement is that there are a number of problems that children may have in school that parents should be aware of. Parents should prepare themselves to deal with these situations.
Lesson Time	20-30 minutes
Materials	Flipchart paperMarkers
Practice	1. Divide participants into groups of 4-5. Give each group a blank flip chart and ask one person in a group to be a note taker.
	2. Give each group 10-15 minutes to answer following questions:
	a. What problems will your children face in school in the US?b. What are your suggested solutions for your children?c. How can you support your children
	3. Ask each team to give a presentation.
Variations	1. Ask participants what problems their children may face at school in the U.S. and record these. Divide participants into small groups of 4-5 and assign one of the problems to each group. Ask participants to find solutions and do a role play to demonstrate the solutions.
